## INTRODUCTION

The following is the 2005 Salem State College Fact Book. This publication reintroduces a version of the *Salem State College Almanac*; last published for Academic Year 1997-1998. As a static publication, this fact book includes only information that is derived from and aligns with data reported to external organizations like the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) through the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) and the Massachusetts Board of Higher Education through the Higher Education Information Resource System (HEIRS). It provides a single source summary of most of the information in those individual reports.

This Fact Book reports only the credit bearing activity of the college. At this time, non-credit activities provided by Salem State College are not reflected. It includes data about the entire college but no subunits other than graduate and undergraduate. The intention is to make the Fact Book available each spring adding annual activity for the previous year and reflect all to the trends in the previous Fact Book.

Institutions have a wide variety of data and information needs. This Fact Book reflects data from comparable points in time, over time. The data can inform decision makers by delineating trends as well as providing context and perspective. Today's data collection and retrieval systems provide far more immediate information for operational decisions and the Fact Book should be used to supplement that data and for providing general information about the college.

This effort to revive the Almanac represents a starting point and will be subject to revision and expansion in future years.

## GLOSSARY AND DATA DEFINITIONS

This glossary is organized by the order in which a term first appears in the Fact Book. Many of these terms have more than one meaning. The definition reflects how the term is used in the section. If a term is defined only once, the term should be interpreted in the same manner in all sections of the Fact book.

### Admissions Data:

**Freshman** – An applicant who has not attended a college other than Salem State College since high school.

**SAT** – Scholastic Aptitude Test, a standardized test, the component parts scores, maximum 800, can be combined into a single score totaling up to 1600.

**Transfer** – An applicant who attended a postsecondary institution other than Salem State College prior to application to Salem State College.

**Applied** – Counts only complete and actionable applications for the Fall Term.

**Acceptance Rate** – The proportion of applicants accepted.

**Yield** – The proportion of accepted applicants who are enrolled in classes on the enrollment freeze date.

**Non Resident Alien** – Individuals who are not citizens, native or naturalized, of the United States. Under federal reporting guidelines Non Resident Alien is a separate racial reporting classification. Non resident alien students who might designate a racial identity for themselves cannot be reported under that racial identity.

**Unknown** – Includes unknown and other.

### Enrollment Data:

**All College** – Includes all students enrolled in credit courses both graduate and undergraduate, day or evening.

**Undergraduate** – Includes students enrolled in undergraduate credit courses.

**Graduate** – Includes students enrolled in graduate credit courses.

To ensure an unduplicated headcount, the few students enrolled in both graduate and undergraduate courses are counted as one or the other based on the majority of the enrolled credits. If a student is enrolled in an equal number of graduate and undergraduate credits, the student is assigned to the category of any matriculated program. If such a student is not matriculated, the student is counted as graduate.

**Degree Seeking** – A student who has been admitted to a course of study intended to result in a degree or certificate.

**Full Time** – An undergraduate student enrolled in 12 or more credits or a graduate student enrolled in 9 or more credits in the given semester.

## GLOSSARY AND DATA DEFINITIONS (CONTINUED)

### **Retention and Completion:**

**Cohort** – Defined each fall including only new, degree seeking students who have not attended any other postsecondary institution since high school and who attended college on a full time basis in their first semester

**Retention Rate** – Proportion of the cohort for a given year who are enrolled in the following fall

**Graduation Rate** – Proportion of the cohort for a given year who have graduated within a given period of time

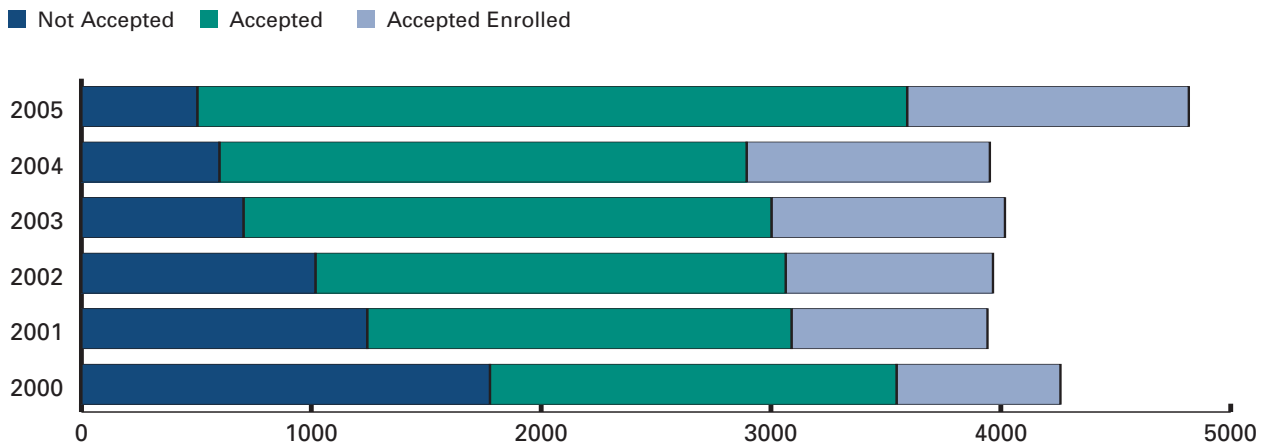

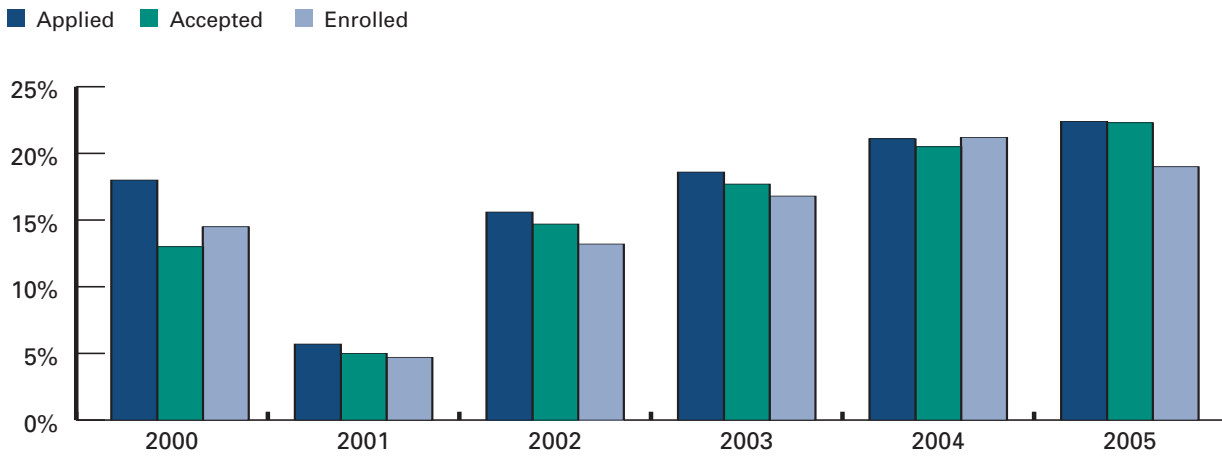

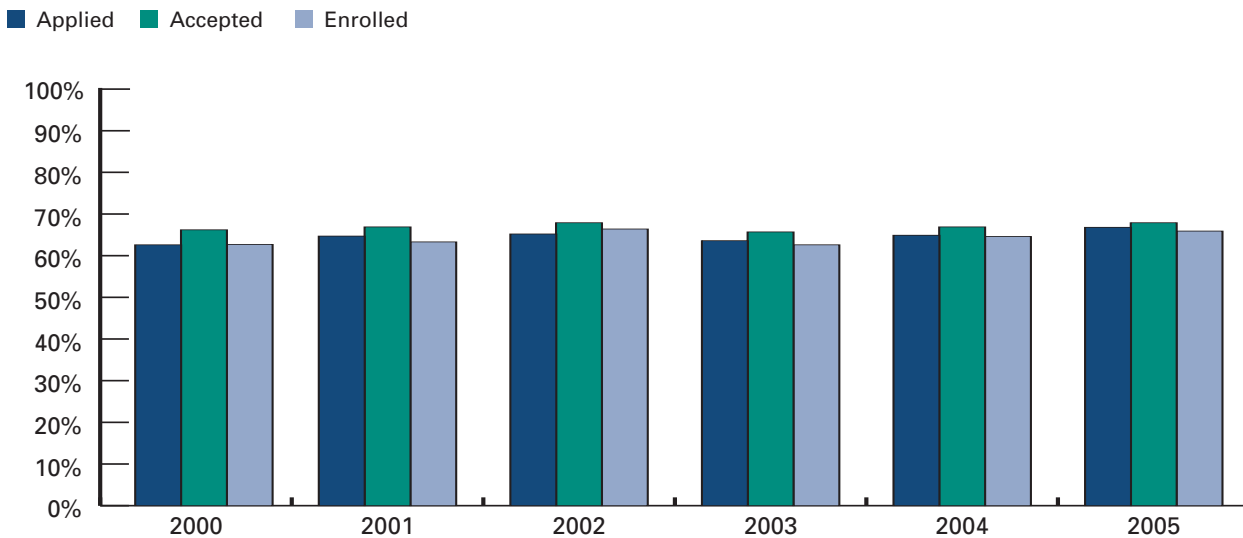
Freshman Applications Fall



Percent of Freshman Applicants, Accepted, and Enrolled Who are Not White

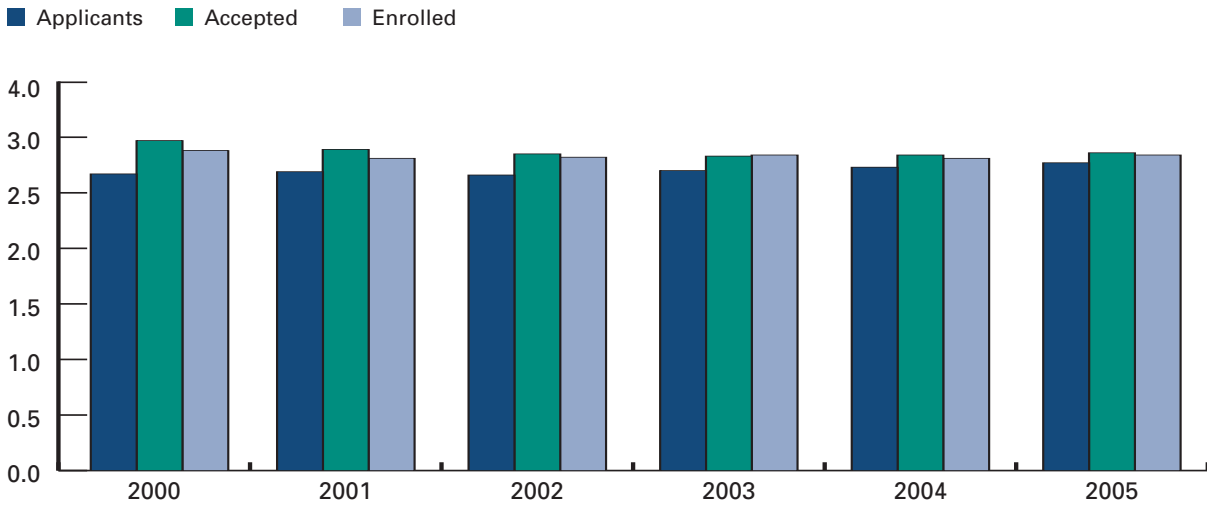


Females as a Percent of Freshman Applicants, Accepted, and Applied

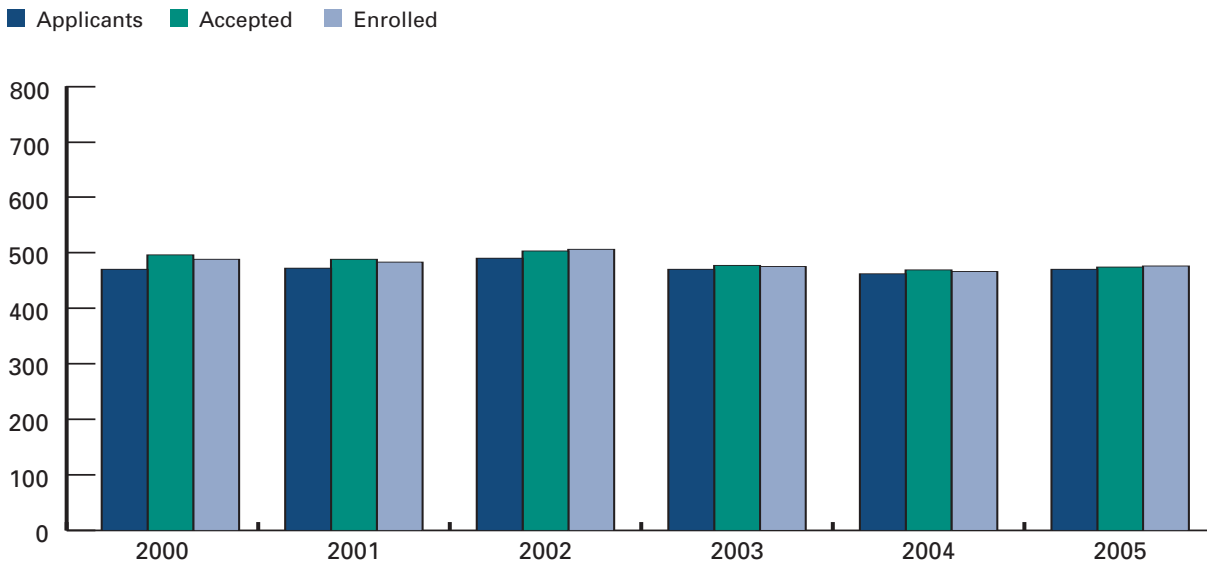


## FRESHMAN ADMISSIONS: FALL 2000 — 2005

Average High School GPA of Applicants, Accepted, and Enrolled Freshman

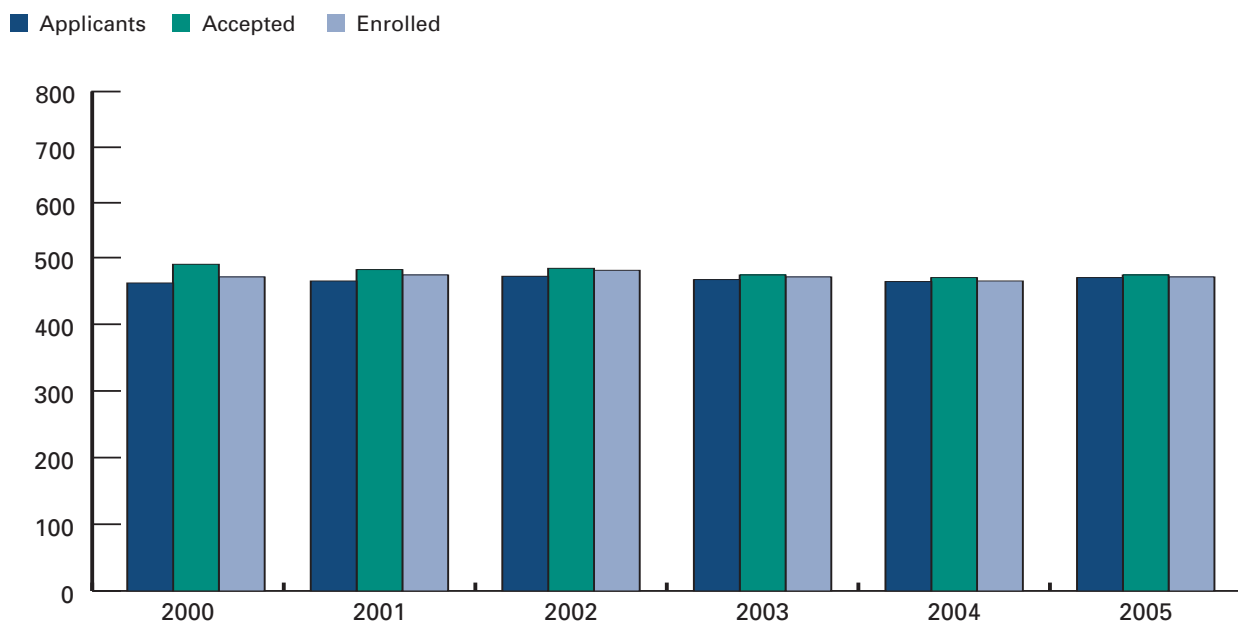


Average Verbal SAT of Applicants, Accepted, and Enrolled Freshman

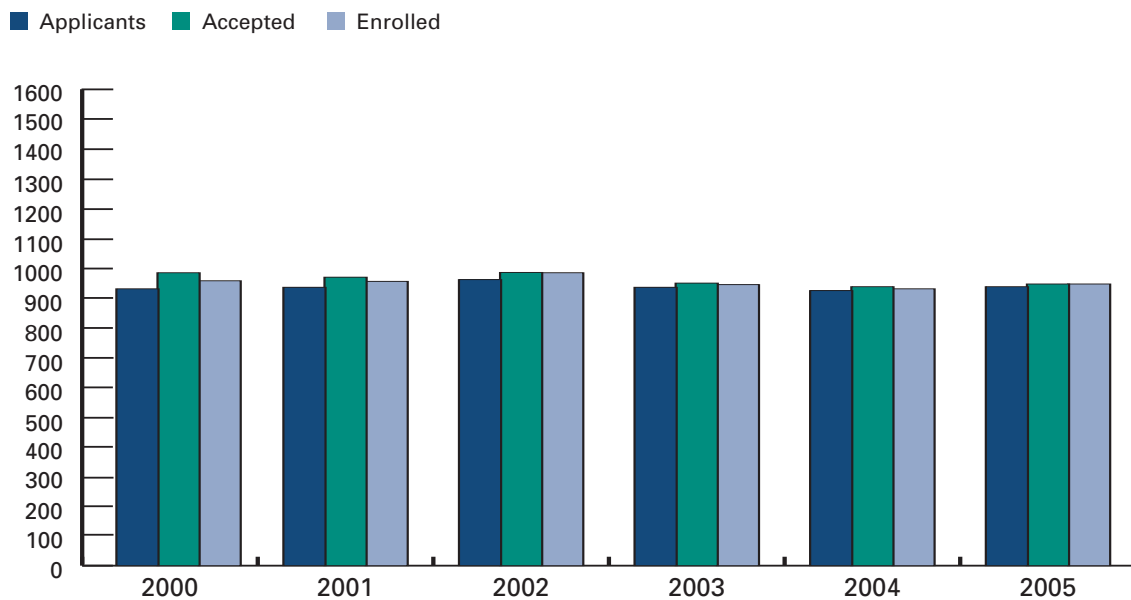


## FRESHMAN ADMISSIONS: FALL 2000 — 2005

Average Math SAT of Applicants, Accepted, and Enrolled Students



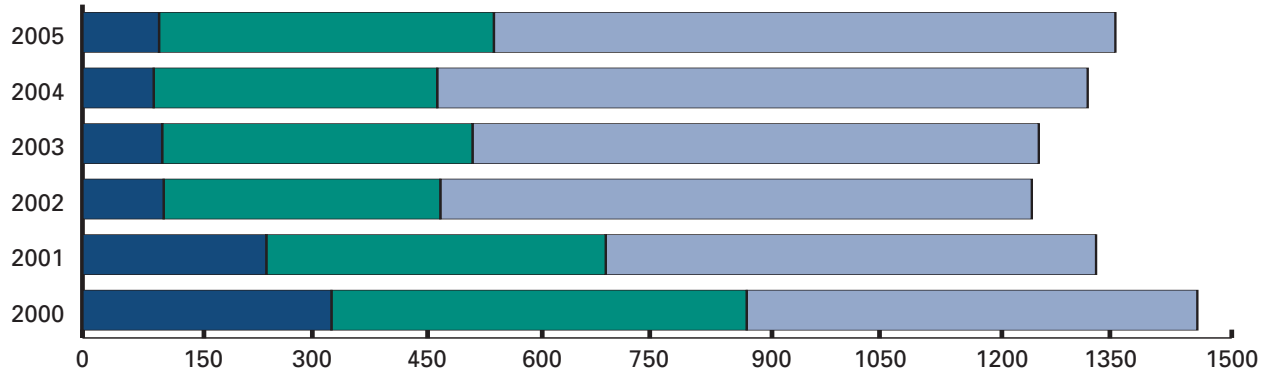
Average Combined SAT of Applicants, Accepted, and Enrolled Students

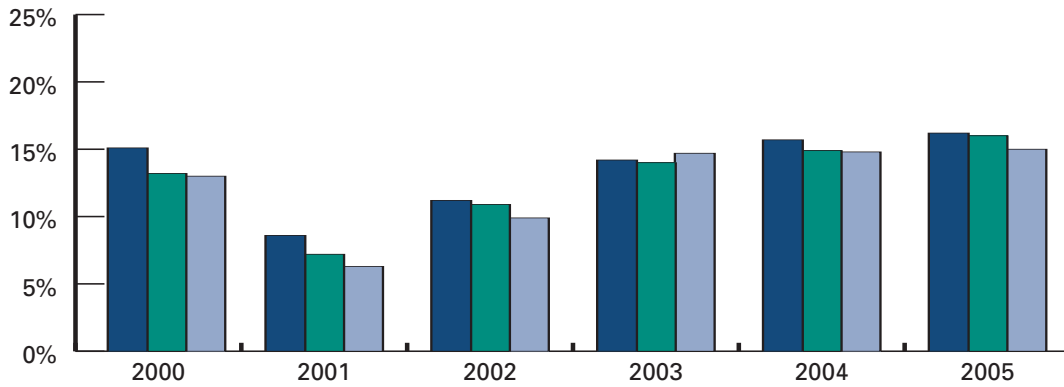

### Percent of Transfer Applicants, Accepted, and Enrolled who are Not White

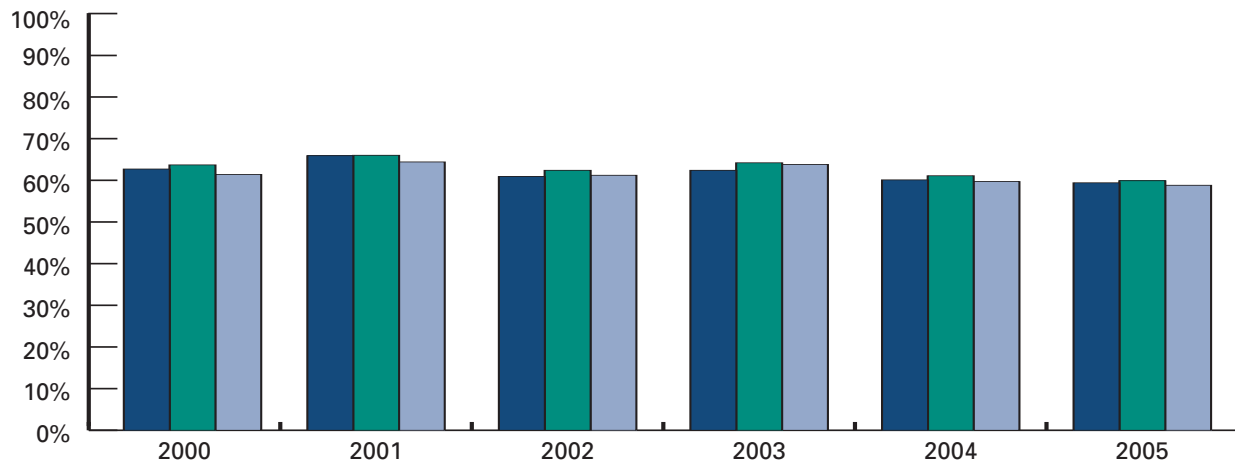

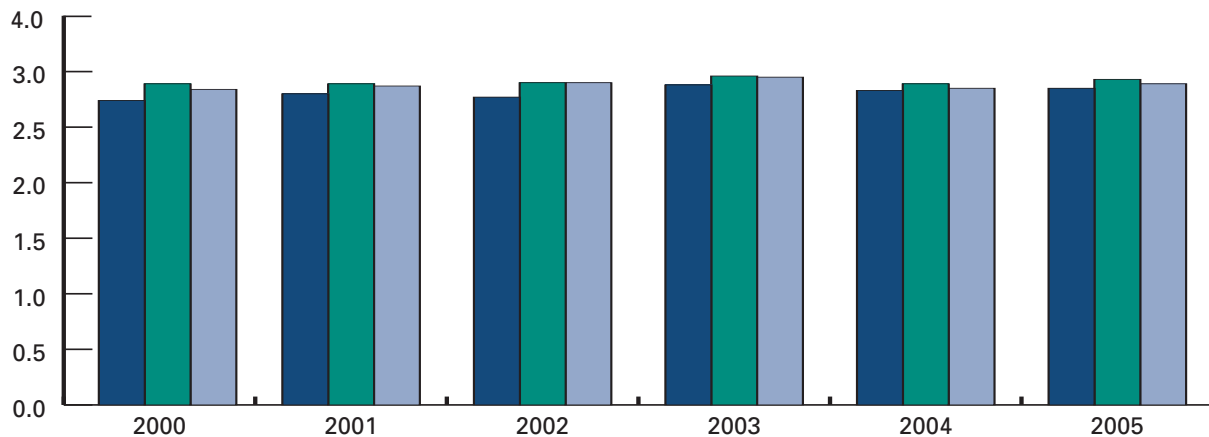
Female as a Percent of Transfer Applicants, Accepted and Enrolled

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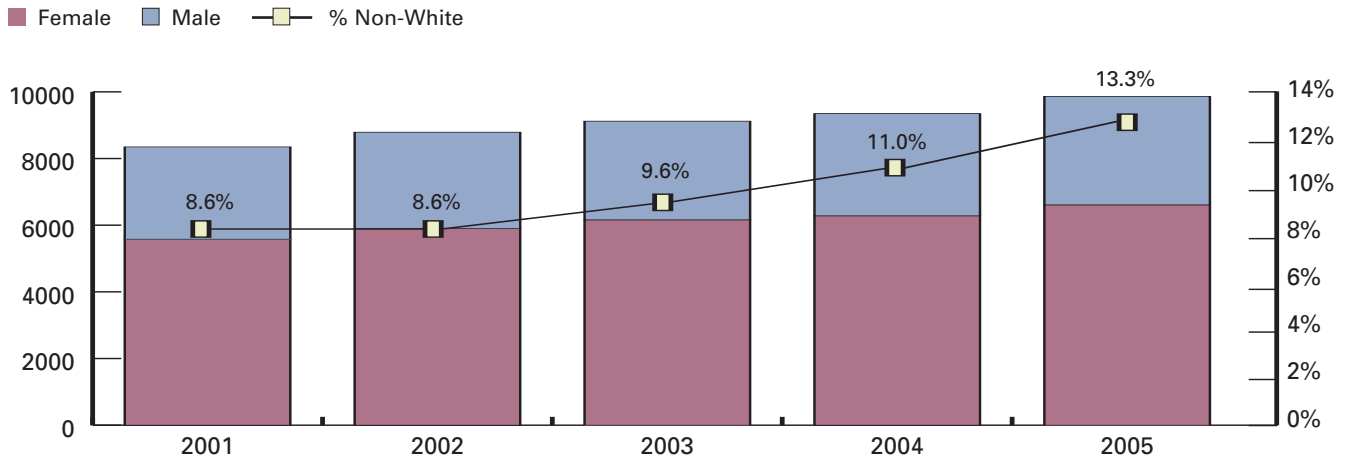

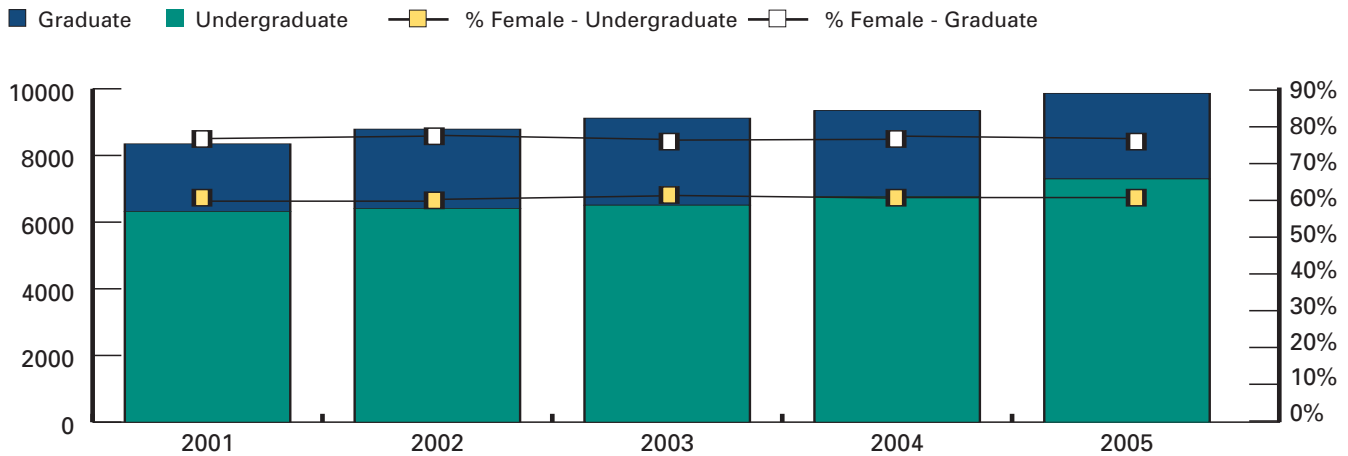


## ENROLLMENT: FALL 2001 — 2005

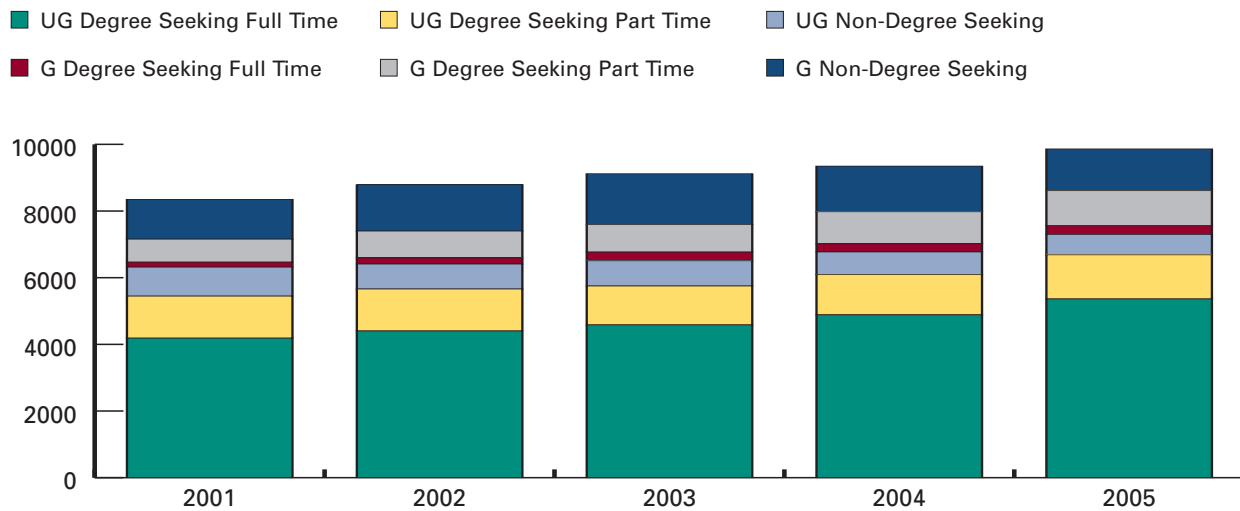
All College Headcount Fall Enrollment Demographics



All College Headcount with Percent Female by Undergraduate/Graduate

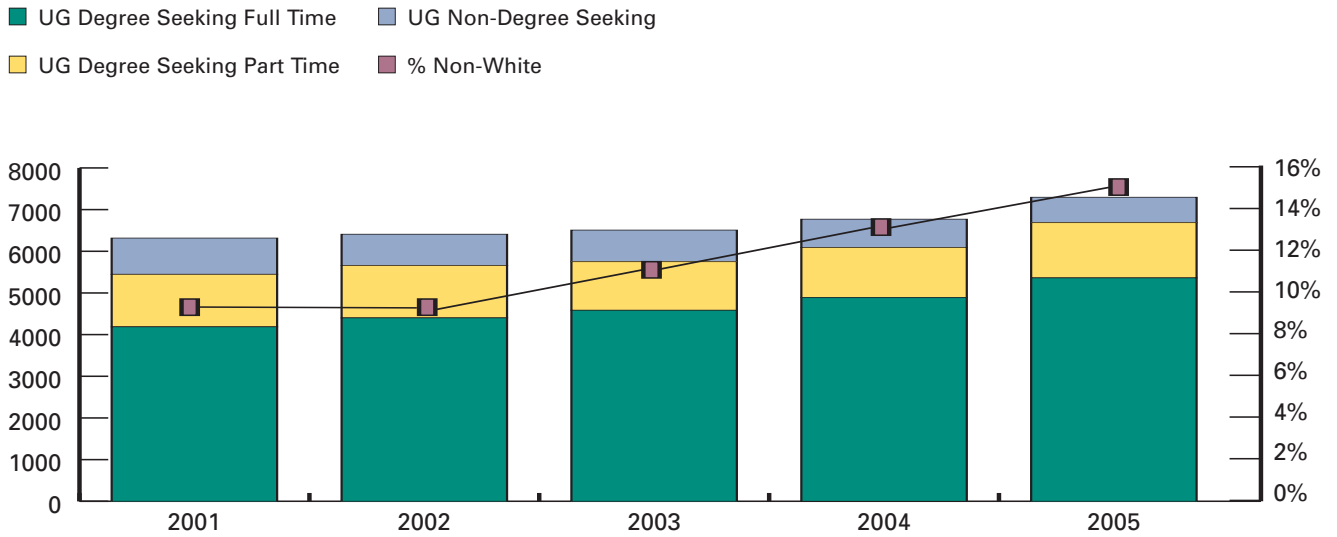


All College Headcount by Level and Attendance Status

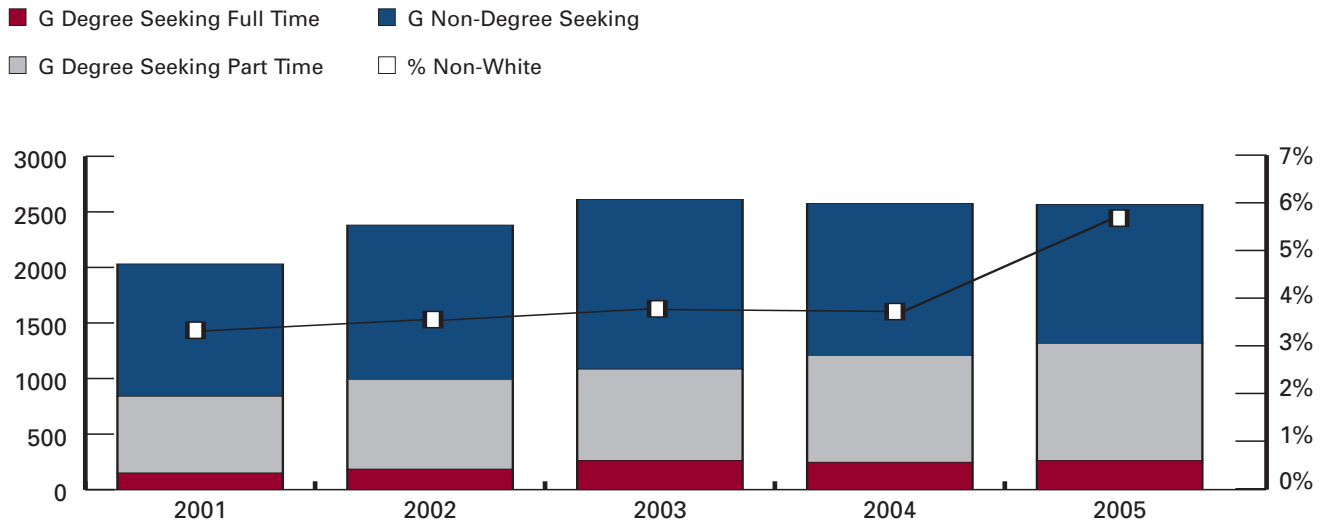

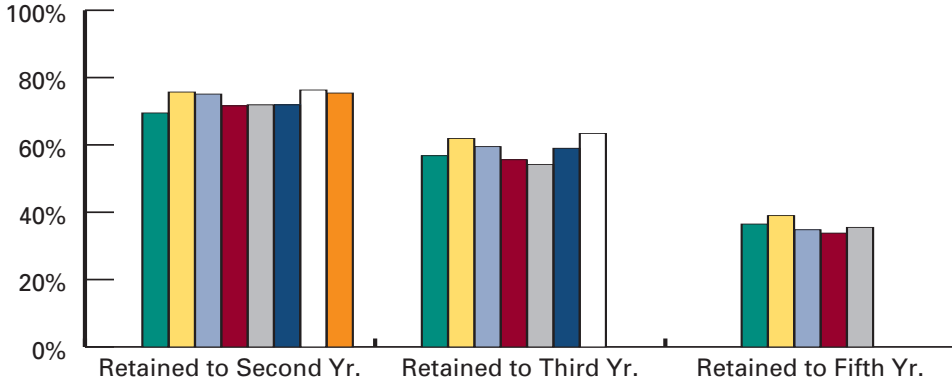

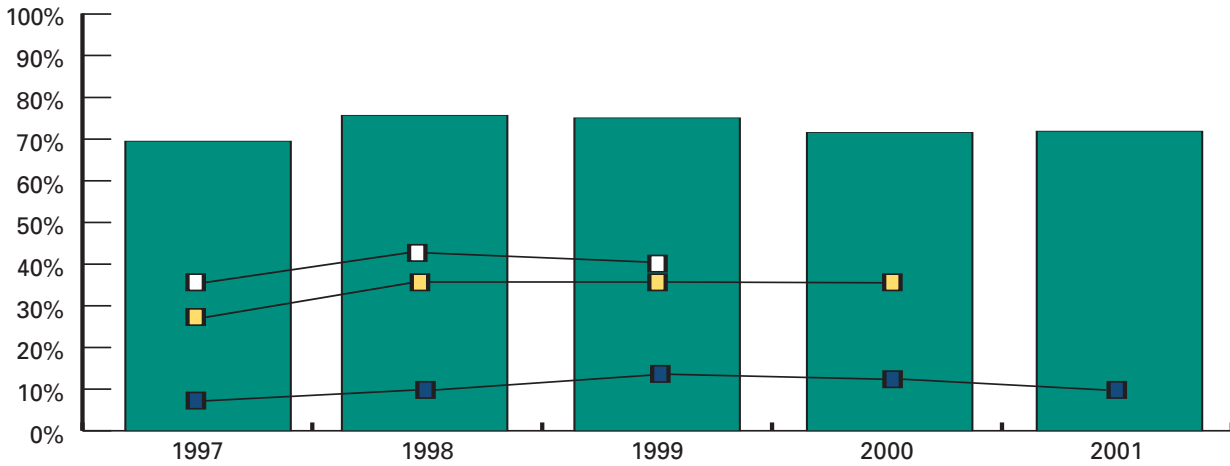

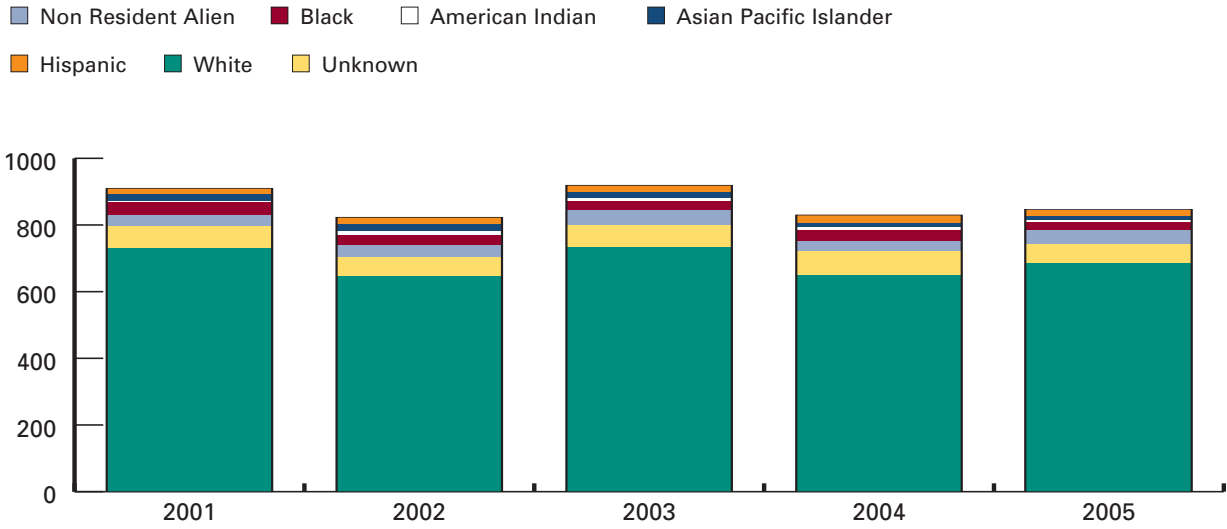
## First Year Retention and 4-6 year Graduation Rates Cohorts 1997-2001

■ Cumulative % Graduated - 5 Years    ■ Cumulative % Graduated - 6 Years

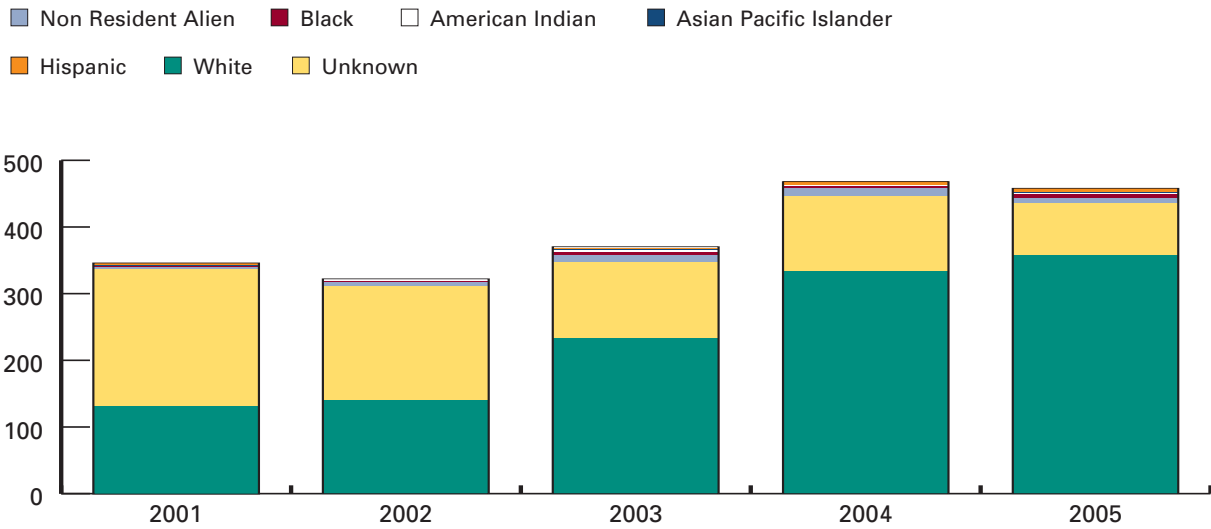

Salem State College converted from a legacy registration system to Peoplesoft beginning with applications for Fall 2001 and with enrollment for Fall 2001. While the overall numbers for both admissions and enrollment in Fall 2001 are accurate, some of the detail information, particularly with regard to race, seems to be inaccurate.

With the conversion to Peoplesoft, the college acquired the ability to report annual enrollment data based on the entire semester rather than based on the compilation of files frozen at each semester's census date. Late semester activity is especially prevalent in the graduate school. Actual growth in graduate enrollment between FY2001 and FY2002 was much more modest than the apparent difference in the Annual Enrollment table.
