

## Park for Free Downtown; Ride the Shuttle to Salem State!

Students can now park in two public garages – Museum Place and Pickering Wharf – in downtown Salem for FREE! Once you get your parking ticket from either of these garages, simply bring it to the ClipperCard Office (before 5pm) to be validated and there will be no charge to you for parking. Students who choose this option can pick up the **Downtown Shuttle** at the MBTA stop on the corner of Washington and New Derby Streets, across from Dunkin Donuts; or students can pick up the **Downtown Shuttle** at the MBTA stop on the corner of Lafayette and New Derby Streets, across from the Salem Fire Station. The **Downtown Shuttle** will stop at the Salem Depot Commuter Rail Station before proceeding to Salem State to make stops at Central Campus and North Campus; and then the shuttle will return to Lafayette Street and Washington Street stops. ## Getting to Salem State

### By Commuter Rail

The Commuter Rail travels from North Station in Boston to points North with trains stopping at Salem Depot. SSC's new **Downtown Shuttle** provides the most direct access between Salem State and Salem Depot. For train and/or bus schedules or information see [www.mbt.com](http://www.mbt.com)

### By MBTA Bus Routes

**455** – This bus stops across from Bowditch Hall and on the corner of Linden Street, near the Sullivan Building. The 455 bus originates from Haymarket Square in Boston via Lynn (providing only local service on weekends). This bus also stops at Salem Depot. The 455W bus provides service to the

Wonderland station in Revere. On the weekend, the 455 or 459 buses also travel between the College and Wonderland Station.

**459** - This bus stops across from Bowditch Hall and on the corner of Linden Street, near the Sullivan Building. The 459 bus begins at Downtown Crossing in Boston, travels to Logan Airport (providing only local service on weekends). This bus also stops at Salem Depot.

### By Subway

**Blue Line** – The nearest subway stop is the Wonderland station in Revere on Route 1A. This line ends at Bowdoin in Boston. The 455W bus travels from Wonderland to the College. On the weekend, the 455 or 459 buses also travel between the College and Wonderland Station.

### By Salem Ferry

The Salem Ferry departs from Blaney Street in Salem and provides high-speed catamaran ferry service, arriving at Central Wharf, the home of the New England Aquarium in Boston. For more information contact [www.salemferry.com](http://www.salemferry.com)

### By Bicycle

## Downtown Shuttle

The convenient **Downtown Shuttle** provides the best way for students to travel from the campus to Salem Depot and to visit the Washington Street and Derby Street areas. Hop on the **Downtown Shuttle** to visit local businesses, tourist attractions, or to ride to the Commuter Rail trains from Salem Depot. This special bus will travel from Central Campus to the Salem Depot consistently from 7:00am – 9:00am and then again from 3pm – 5pm on weekdays. This shuttle follows the college shuttle service route from 9am – 3pm, in between the Downtown morning and afternoon service.

## The Downtown Shuttle Route

The **Downtown Shuttle** takes passengers from Building 1 at Central Campus; to the Horace Mann School MBTA stop on Loring Avenue; to the corner of New Derby Street and Lafayette Street (across from the Salem Fire Station); to the corner of Washington Street and New Derby Street (near the Dunkin Donuts); and to the Salem Depot. This bus, then, returns to the Washington Street corner before traveling back to Central Campus via Canal Street. This loop is expected to take approximately 45 minutes to complete, depending on traffic and weather. The last loop of the Downtown Shuttle each day will be as follows: leave South Campus at 4:05pm; leave Central Campus at 4:15pm; leave Horace Mann at 4:25pm; stop at New Derby Street stop at 4:40pm; arrive at Salem Depot at 5:00pm.

## Campus Parking

**Note:** Sections of each parking lot on campus are marked with Lot A signs for faculty and administration; Lot B signs for College staff; and Lot C signs for student parking. The map in this guide shows where parking is located on each campus, designated with a P. Once in each lot, look for signs designating Lots A, B and C.

### North Campus

Library Lot – Enter from College Drive, off Lafayette Street. Lot A is for Faculty, Administration and Designated Staff parking.

Peabody Lot – Enter from College Drive, off Lafayette Street. Lot B is for Staff parking & Lot C is for Student parking.

### South Campus

Lot entrance is Harrison Road. Lot A is for Faculty, Administration and Designated Staff parking. Lot B is for Staff & Lot C is for Students.

### Upper South Campus

Lot entrance is off Loring Avenue. Lot A for Faculty, Administration and Designated Staff parking. Lot B is for Staff parking.

### Central Campus

Lot entrance is off Loring Avenue. Lot A is for Faculty, Administration and Designated Staff. Lot B is for Staff parking & Lot C is for Students.

### O'Keefe Center

Lot entrances are off Forest & Atlantic Avenues. Lot A is for Faculty, Administration & Designated Staff. Lot B is for Staff and Lot C is for Students.

**Canal Street Lots** – Two small lots are accessible from Canal Street, across from the Gardner Mattress business. Lot C is for Students.

**Handicapped spaces** available as posted in Lots A, B and C on North, South and Central Campuses, and the O'Keefe Center.

**Visitor parking** is available in C Lots on North, South and Central Campuses and the O'Keefe Center as directed by the Department of Public Safety.

## Campus Shuttle

The **Campus Shuttle Bus**' traditional routes will continue to connect Salem State's four main campus sites (North, South, Central and the O'Keefe Center). Two buses circulate through these campuses following the route below. One bus will ride from 6:30am -2:30pm; a second bus will travel from 8:30am -4:30pm; and a third bus will circulate from 4:30pm-7:30pm.

## The Campus Shuttle Route

The **Campus Shuttle** begins at Meier Hall on Lafayette Street; continues to the bus stop near Peabody Hall on College Drive; travels to the O'Keefe Center stop on Canal Street; turns left on Ocean Avenue; left on to Broadway, passing the new parking lot on Broadway; proceeds to South Campus, stopping at the Bates Complex and then the Harrington Building; traveling back on Loring Avenue, the bus turns on to Central Campus, and stops near Building 1; travels to the Horace Mann School MBTA stop on Loring Avenue; and returns to Meier Hall. This loop is expected to take approximately 20 minutes to complete.
