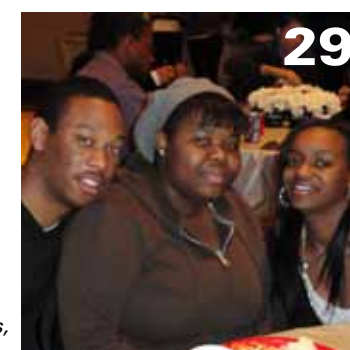

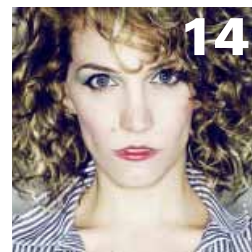

Kent State Remembered

On May 4, 1970 the Ohio National Guard opened fire on a group of student protesters demonstrating against the Vietnam War at Kent State University. Eleven students were injured. Four students died. Martin Luther King Jr. Convocation Keynote Speaker: Ernest Green

Member of the Little Rock Nine

Ernest Green earned his high school diploma from Central High School in Little Rock, Arkansas, where he was also born. He and eight other black students were the first to integrate Central High, following the 1954 U.S. Supreme Court decision in Brown v. Board of Education that declared segregation illegal. They later would become known as the "Little Rock Nine."
