Application for Dual Enrollment

COMMONWEALTH DUAL ENROLLMENT AT SALEM STATE UNIVERSITY

Salem State University is a proud participant in the Commonwealth Dual Enrollment Partnership. Salem State will focus our efforts to enroll qualified individuals with particular emphasis on potential first-generation college and low-income students. Eligible Massachusetts high school students can enroll in college courses and simultaneously earn high school and college credit. Town Eligibility: Students are eligible if meeting one of the town/location categories below:

Students currently enrolled in a designated Massachusetts secondary school, residing hometown or home school (public or private) in the following towns: Chelsea, Danvers, Everett, Gloucester, Haverhill, Lynn, Malden, Peabody, Revere, Rockport, Salem, Salisbury, Saugus, Wakefield, or Winthrop.

OR

As of Spring 2023, we have expanded eligibility to include all high schools located within Essex County. Each of these additional high schools may enroll up to five students per semester in the Salem State University Dual Enrollment program. Student selection is at the discretion of the high school Guidance Director.

ACADEMIC ELIGIBILITY

- A minimum high school grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 is required to participate
- · Approval from the student's guidance counselor/school official is required
- An overall college GPA of 2.0 or higher (for Salem State) is required to remain eligible for dual enrollment participation in subsequent semester(s)
- *Students who do not meet the above requirements may still enroll in Salem State University courses by registering and paying for costs on their own. View a full listing of <u>classes</u> and <u>tuition and fees</u>.

PROCEDURES

Each semester interested and qualified students must meet with their guidance counselor/school official to obtain the proper documentation. Completed applications will be reviewed by the student's guidance counselor and if accepted, forwarded, by the counselor, to Salem State for processing to dualenrollment@salemstate.edu. Counselor must also include an up-to-date official high school transcript with the completed Dual Enrollment Application. Notification of a student's registration for classes will be sent via email to the student and the student's guidance counselor.

Placement into the dual enrollment program, or into any specific courses, is not guaranteed. At the end of the semester, an official Salem State transcript will be sent directly to the guidance counselor for appropriate action.

COST

Students who are accepted in the dual enrollment program will have their tuition and fees waived by the university for a maximum of one class per semester (fall and spring semesters ONLY). Students will be responsible for textbooks, transportation and instructional materials as well as any additional classes.

NOTICES

- The student's high school reserves the right to sanction, or not, an applicant's participation in the program.
- Salem State University has the right to discontinue a student's participation in the Dual Enrollment Program.
- Acceptance into the Dual Enrollment Program does not constitute admission into a Salem State University degree program.
- Courses not meeting minimum enrollments may be cancelled.

TRANSCRIPTS

Credits earned at Salem State University will be reflected on the student's high school academic transcript as well as their Salem State University transcript.

COURSE ELIGIBILITY

The Department of Higher Education has placed an emphasis on courses that are "easily transferable" and qualify under the <u>MassTransfer Gen Ed Foundation</u>, or is within the disciplines of computer science, technology or engineering. mass.edu/masstransfer/gened

- An eligible course must be a 100 or 200 level, credit-bearing college-level course that counts for no less than three credit hours.
- The course must fall into a Salem State University General Education Category.
- Written Communication (W-I)
- Oral Communication (OC)
- Personal Growth and Responsibility (PGR)
- Creative Expression and Appreciation (CEA)
- World Cultures (WC)
- Human Past (HP)
- Contemporary Society (CS)
- Scientific Reasoning (SR)
- Quantitative Reasoning (QR)
- First-year seminar courses, physical activity courses and honors level courses are not eligible.
- Some courses may require other pre-requisite courses to be taken for eligibility.
- Additional courses will require payment.

CLASS MODALITIES

In Person: These classes meet face-to-face. All instruction occurs in a designated campus location (classroom) during regularly scheduled predetermined days and times (synchronous) for which instructor and students are physically present throughout; will require detailed health and safety protocols for engagement among faculty and students.

Hybrid Asynchronous: Student learning occurs both in scheduled in-person class meetings during specific published times and locations, and in asynchronous online class interactions. Typically, hybrid asynchronous classes will meet for fewer hours in person than standard in person classes, with more out of class work required.

Hybrid Synchronous: Student learning occurs both in scheduled in-person class meetings during specific published times and locations, and in synchronous online class meetings during specific published times. Typically, hybrid synchronous classes will meet for fewer hours in person than standard in person classes, but will have required online class meetings.

Asynchronous Online: Student learning occurs exclusively online, asynchronously; no convenings of the entire class; student engagement with the faculty member occurs as requested via a digital platform. There will be no prescheduled meeting times either online or in-person.

Blended Modality: Student learning occurs primarily online, asynchronously, but with pre-scheduled synchronous in virtual convenings of the entire class (e.g. via ZOOM).

Synchronous Online: Student learning occurs exclusively online, during regularly scheduled predetermined days and times, for which instructor and students are virtually present throughout (e.g. via ZOOM).

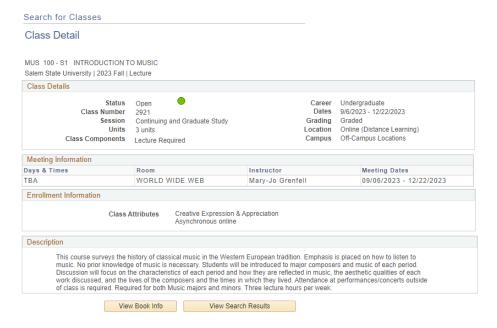
